Help Flash.

If your vehicle breaks down on the side of the road, you must warn other users. Help Flash is a compact, automatic and stand-alone warning system.



Using it is intuitive at stressful moments.
It protects you in seconds and makes you visible to all other drivers.
Quick and simple, it is highly effective in emergency situations.

Current warning systems:

- Do not place the safety of a vehicle's occupants first.
- Are not efficient because it takes several minutes to use them.
- Cannot be used on two-wheeled vehicles.
- · Cannot be used by persons with reduced mobility

Automatic magnetic activation. Utmost ease and simplicity of use. Stick it on any metal surface, and it will begin emitting an automatic, flashing yellow signal. You can also activate it manually.

Additional white light. Use it like a torch!
